

## Charterhouse and London Road Cemetery, Coventry

Charterhouse, Coventry, began life as a 14th century monastery before becoming a family home. Its inhabitants include Robert Dudley, famous favourite of Queen Elizabeth I, and it is home to some of the finest examples of medieval and renaissance art in England. Dr Nat Alcock, Co-Chair of WLHS, will give a brief talk on his research into the building before you explore Charterhouse at your own pace.

The outing also includes a guided tour of nearby London Road Cemetery, designed by architect Joseph Paxton. The cemetery is an early example of the 19th century 'garden cemetery' movement and is a place of natural beauty, with several impressive monuments. Those buried include most of Coventry's Victorian pioneers of transport.

Ticket price does NOT include lunch. Facilities on site or bring a packed lunch.
